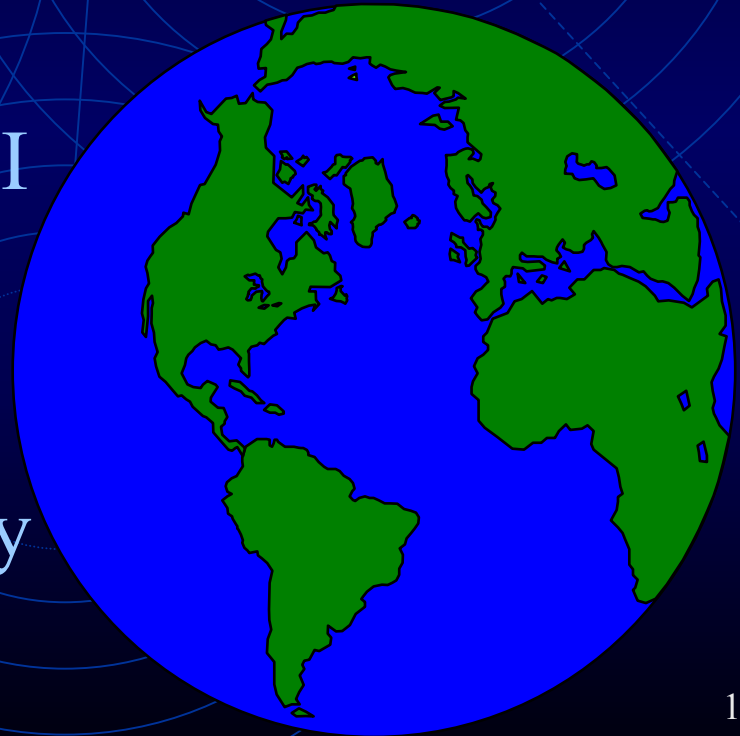

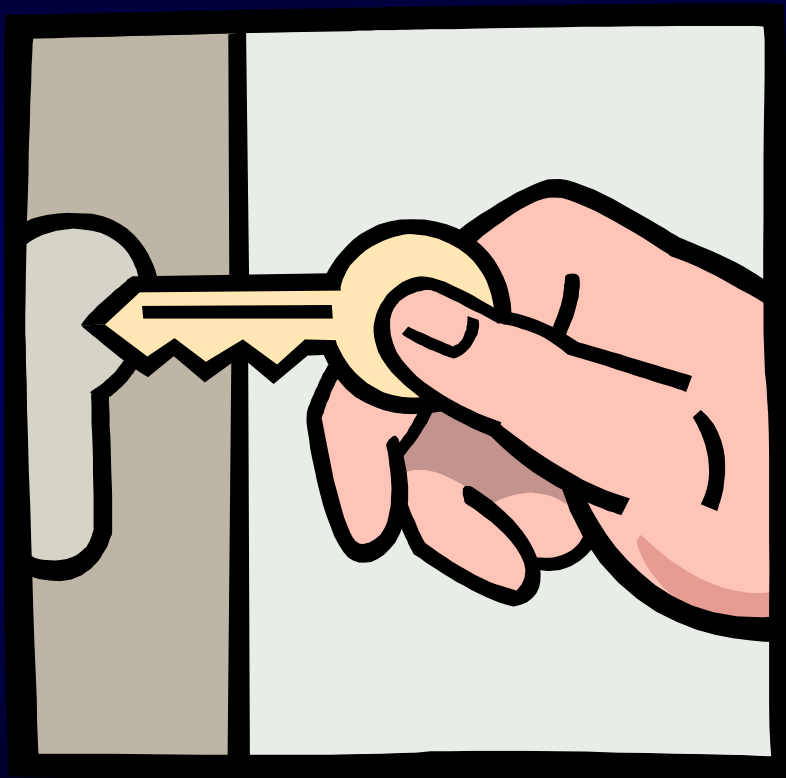


Basic Orientation is Vital to Implementation
